

MASSES AT ST. FRANCIS XAVIER PARISH

THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT BEGINS FEBRUARY 22ND Mass with the Blessing and Distribution of Ashes at 8 a.m.

Ash Wednesday and 7 p.m. Ash Wednesday. Lent is a time for penance and repentance, for almsgiving and prayer, for working to change attitudes that are not pleasing to God. The celebration of Easter, of being reborn in the Risen Lord to a new life, will only have meaning to the degree that we 'die to the old self'. Thus, the Church asks us to live this period of Lent, with Christ in the desert, as a period of forty days devoted to inward renewal through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Let us prayerfully consider before Lent how we might make best use of this time to imitate the Lord in His dedication to the Father so that His resurrection may take deep root in our thoughts, words and actions throughout Lent and forever.

During Lent we will have Mass at **7 p.m. on Mondays** and at **8 a.m. on Tuesday to Friday**.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be prayed **Mondays at 6:30 p.m. beginning Monday, March 6.**

CONFESIONS: During Lent a priest will be available for confession one half hour before the weekday Masses and 3/4 hour before weekend Masses.
